COVID-19 - WEEKLY CHECK IN LOG #54 April 21, 2021 Summary

Invited Participants: Sector Calls

OBA, FOLA, LSO, LAO, the Advocates' Society, & OTLA Superior Court of Justices in Ontario, Court of Appeal for Ontario, & Ontario Court of Justice MAG – Political, Department staff, and the Recovery Secretariat

Issues discussed:

1. COURTS

- On April 20th, as a result of the strengthened stay-at-home order and the critical situation with the pandemic, the SCJ issued an Updated Notice to Profession and Public Regarding Court Proceedings (<u>here</u>). Note that even virtual trials are affected.
- The stay-at-home orders do not affect any virtual trials at the Court of Appeal of Ontario. It is not known yet if a Notice is being planned by the OCJ.
- On April 16th, Chief Justice Morawetz's Supplementary Notice to the Profession and Litigants in Civil and Family Matters Regarding the Caselines Pilot, E-Filing, and Fee Payment was amended today to require the uploading of a Participant Information form (instead of a counsel slip). Other amendments include clarifications and an implementation update. More information is available in the notice <u>here</u>.

2. MAG

- BILL 245, Accelerating Access to Justice Act, 2021, received Royal Assent on April 19th and will come into effect on a date determined by the Lieutenant General. More information on Bill 245 can be found <u>here</u>.
- MAG Court Services have increased the size cap on files accepted by their system. Details can be found online once logged in.
- CASELINES & JUSTICE SERVICE WORKING GROUP: MAG has agreed to arrange for CaseLines and Justice Service Ontario working groups to discuss ways to improve the systems and provide input. 3. RECOVERY SECRETARIAT

- REMINDER: VACCINE INFORMATION: The Recovery Secretariat issued a Notice titled "March Vaccination Sector Information – courts and justice system workers (including probation and parole)" to provide information to support an understanding of occupations that may be considered essential within the "courts and justice system workers (including probation and parole)" category. You are encouraged to continue to monitor the <u>Getting a COVID-19 vaccine in Ontario webpage</u> and to connect with your local public health unit for details about when and how you, or your staff, could get a vaccine and review the Ministry of Health's document called <u>COVID-19: Guidance for Prioritization of Phase 2 Populations for COVID-19 Vaccination</u> which provides additional clarity.
- REMINDER! Version 6 of the Recovery Secretariat's Guidebook, "COVID-19: Recommended Precautionary Measures for Resuming Court Operations" is now available on <u>Ontario.ca</u>, in both <u>English</u> and <u>French</u>. As a

reminder, the Guidebook is a living document and may continue to be updated over time, in response to feedback and/or evolving provincial guidance regarding COVID-19.

5. LAWPRO

6. LAO

CONSULTATIONS: Legal Aid Ontario will begin seeking input on possible new rules to govern legal aid in Ontario. On April 20th, FOLA participated in a technical briefing hosted by LAO and attended by all members from the Alliance for Sustainable Legal Aid (ASLA). We will be meeting again with LAO on April 29th to raise initial concerns/questions/comments and have been asked to submit our initial issues by the end of this week to the ASLA team. 7. LSO

The Law Society of Ontario's Technology Task Force's "Regulatory Sandbox for Innovative Technological Legal Services" Report is scheduled for consideration at tomorrow's Convocation (April 22nd). If approved, a fiveyear pilot project will be launched in Q4 of 2021. Learn more.

8. FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

The Federal Government is conducting a Canadian Legal Problems Survey (CLPS) to identify the kinds of serious problems people face, how they attempt to resolve them, and how these experiences may impact their lives. The information collected will be used to better understand the various methods people use to resolve problems - not just formal systems such as courts and tribunals, but also informal channels such as self-help strategies. The survey aims to gather information that will help governments better understand the characteristics and mechanisms involved in those situations, evaluate Canadian's access to legal help and costs associated with legal issues. The survey results will inform the development of tools and measures to support Canadians experiencing legal issues and will be used in the evaluation of federal contributions to civil legal aid. In addition, the information will be used to inform and develop programs to address Canadians' legal needs and problems, such as supporting community justice centres, enhancing legal literacy and other people-centred approaches to access to justice. While it is designed for consumers of legal services, you may still be interested in taking part. The survey closes on April 30th. Learn more here.
