COVID-19 - WEEKLY CHECK IN LOG #49 March 17, 2021 Summary

Invited Participants: Sector Calls

Issues discussed:

1. COURTS

- Naming conventions of electronically filed documents with the Ontario Court of Appeal can be found here and naming conventions of electronically filed documents with the SCJ can be found here.
- ❖ On March 15th, the SCJ updated their Consolidated Notice to the Profession and Public Regarding the Small Claims Court available here.
- On March 15th, the SCJ updated the Commercial List and Estates List Filing Direction here. Of note, effective March 15, 2021, references to uploading documents to Sync.com have been removed as the court will exclusively use the CaseLines document-sharing platform.
- On March 15th, the Court of Appeal for Ontario released a new practice direction that will come into force on March 29, 2021. It will be called the Consolidated Practice Direction Regarding Proceedings in the Court of Appeal During the COVID-19 Pandemic. The English version can also be found at this link. - The SCJ is working on an updated notice regarding jury matters and in-person hearings. FOLA expects to have that by the end of the week.
- ❖ We can expect a new OCJ Directive regarding filing naming protocols in the next couple of weeks.
- ❖ The SCJ, in collaboration with the Ministry of the Attorney General, is seeking candidates to join new DRO panels for the Kingston, Kitchener and Welland Unified Family Courts. You can read more here.

2. MAG

- ❖ There have been a few member questions regarding Small Estates Forms. They are posted on the Ontario Court Forms site here: Rules of Civil Procedure Forms | Ontario Court Services (ontariocourtforms.on.ca). They are in grey shading as they have not yet come into force. Currently, the MS Word versions are posted but the site will soon be updated (targeting March 22) to include the PDF versions. There is another section on the court forms site that includes pre-formatted and fillable estates forms (Rules of Civil Procedure Forms / Preformatted, Fillable Estates Forms | Ontario Court Services (ontariocourtforms.on.ca)). It is anticipated that this section will be updated by April 1st.
- The Judicial Appointments Advisory Committee has a call for applications for two judicial positions in Sudbury (family & criminal) and one judicial appointment for Halton (criminal). More information can be found here.
- * Many forms related to the Divorce Act and the Children's Law Reform Act have been updated (and some continue to be updated). You can find all information (including links to forms, materials, and training) here.

- MAG has released details of its Phase 2 COVID-19 vaccination distribution plan which will start on March 15, 2021. You can learn more on our MAG webpage under the "REOPENING PLANS ONTARIO'S COURTS" here.
- ❖ The Ontario government is following the progress of <u>Bill C-22</u>, an act to amend the Criminal Code and the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act as it proceeds through the federal government to see if they will need to make any amendments to existing Ontario laws as a result.
